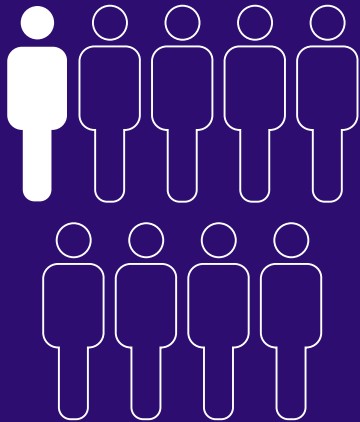

ADNI4 is the next frontier.

ADNI4 aims to learn about participants' brain health over time.

What is involved?

- * Memory and thinking tests
- * Imaging scans (PET, MRI)
- * Blood, urine and other samples

Reimbursement for select completed activities



ADNI4 needs volunteers who:

- Are 55 to 90 years of age
- Have either:
 - Normal memory,
 - Mild Cognitive Impairment*, or
 - Dementia*
- Have a study partner
- Are willing to commit to the study for five years
- Are available for in-person visits with some virtual options

**Diagnosis is not required (testing is part of study screening).*
